

Study Programme Overview

If you see yourself studying to become a Forensic Scientist, Criminal Psychologist or Senior Crime Scene Investigator, read on...

This programme is intended for post-16 learners, who aim to progress to higher education to study Forensic Science, Criminology or Psychology, then progress to employment in these fields.

Forensic science is made up of various specialisms and you will study a multitude of these. In addition to your main programme, you will also engage in activities to develop your English, Maths and employability skills.

The qualification is equivalent to three A Levels studied over two years.

What You'll Learn

You will learn to understand the workings of the criminal mind; how crime scenes are investigated and the procedures followed; and how to collect and analyse crime scene evidence.

Topics include environmental forensics; forensic fire investigation; applications of criminology; applications of criminal and forensic psychology; forensic genetics; and practical scientific procedures and techniques. There is a strong emphasis on practical laboratory work to support the learning.

Elements of Study

Your programme consists of the following elements:

- Study of your chosen vocational subject (50% of your programme)
- English and maths (continued until the achievement of GCSE grade 4 (C) or equivalent)
- Employability skills (e.g. punctuality, attendance, communication and team work)
- Work experience (giving you a taste of working life)
- Tutorial & personal development (e.g. healthy living, volunteering and citizenship skills)
- Fitness testing
- Fitness, health and lifestyle development

Entry Requirements

A minimum of five GCSEs, graded 9-4/A*-C, including English, Maths and Science OR a Merit/Distinction in a relevant Level 2 Qualification. You will also sit an interview.

How will I be Assessed?

- External exams
- Practical tasks by employers
- Written assignment/coursework
- Examinations in some science units

Enrichment


